Coaching and Training Equipment Policy



1. POLICY OBJECTIVE AND EXPECTED OUTCOMES

The objective of this policy is to ensure KCSC coaches are qualified and supported with up to date training, a club wide curriculum, expected behaviour and standards and sufficient equipment to deliver quality coaching programs in a strategic and coordinated way.

The policy aims to address the KCSC Strategic plan 2013, which highlights the clubs focus on “**skill development through strong coaching structures**” and provides objectives “**to present the club as a benchmark, both on and off the field**”, and “**to foster a culture of inclusion and success within the organisation**”

2. COACHING POLICY STATEMENT

KCSC will aim to

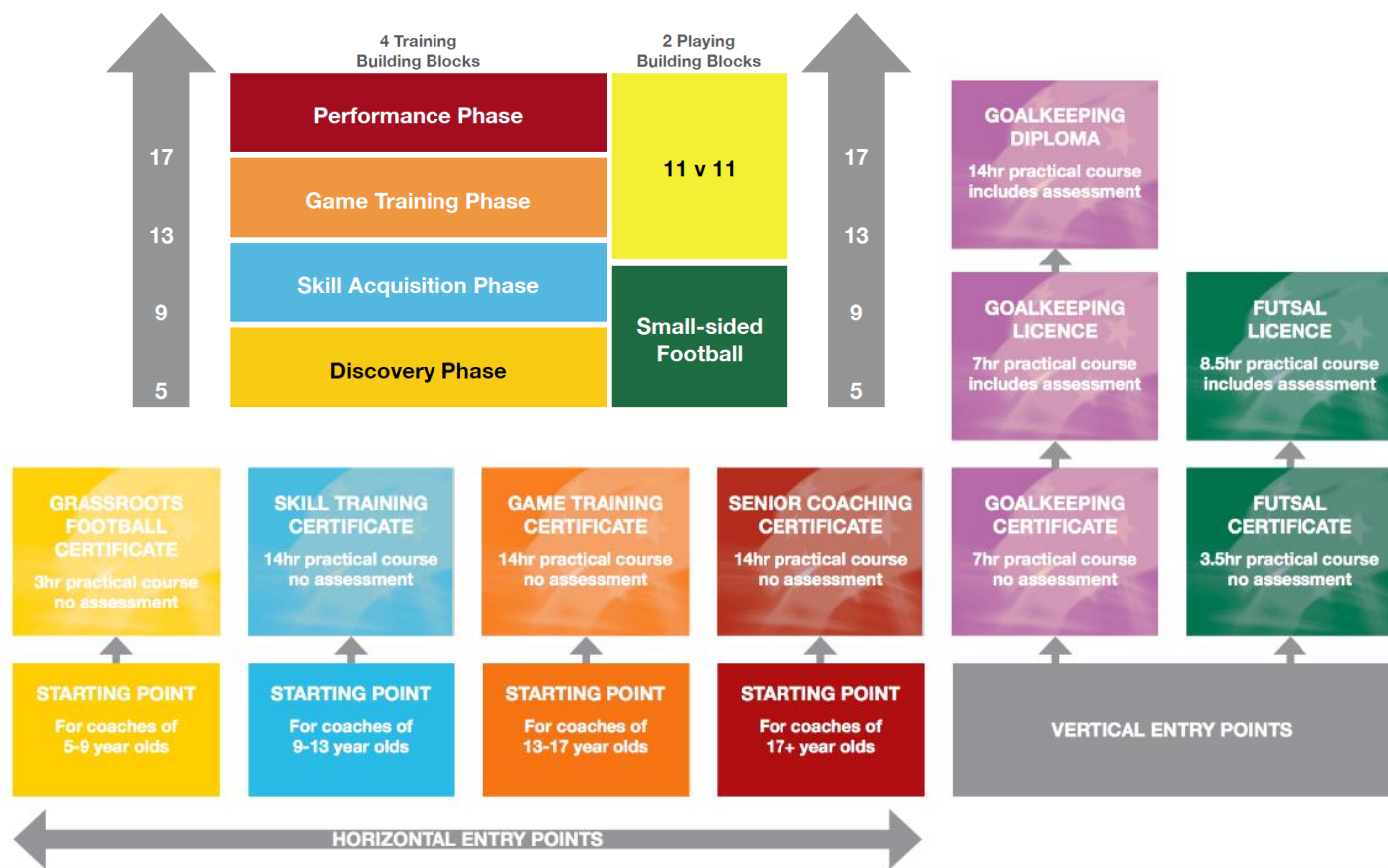
- embed the FFA National Coaching curriculum into its coaching programs across all teams.
- recruit coaches with qualifications relevant to the team they are coaching.
- support coaches to undertake or renew relevant training courses through subsidy or full cost recovery if feasible.
- provide ongoing mentoring and support for coaches.
- support diversity and inclusion principles in the selection of coaches.
- Recruit coaches with the following attributes.

KCSC Coaches will

- commit to undertake relevant training within 12 months of appointment if unqualified.
- commit to ongoing learning and improvement.
- Adhere to relevant Codes of conduct, Club procedures and Safety Requirements
- provide up to date Working with Children Checks.

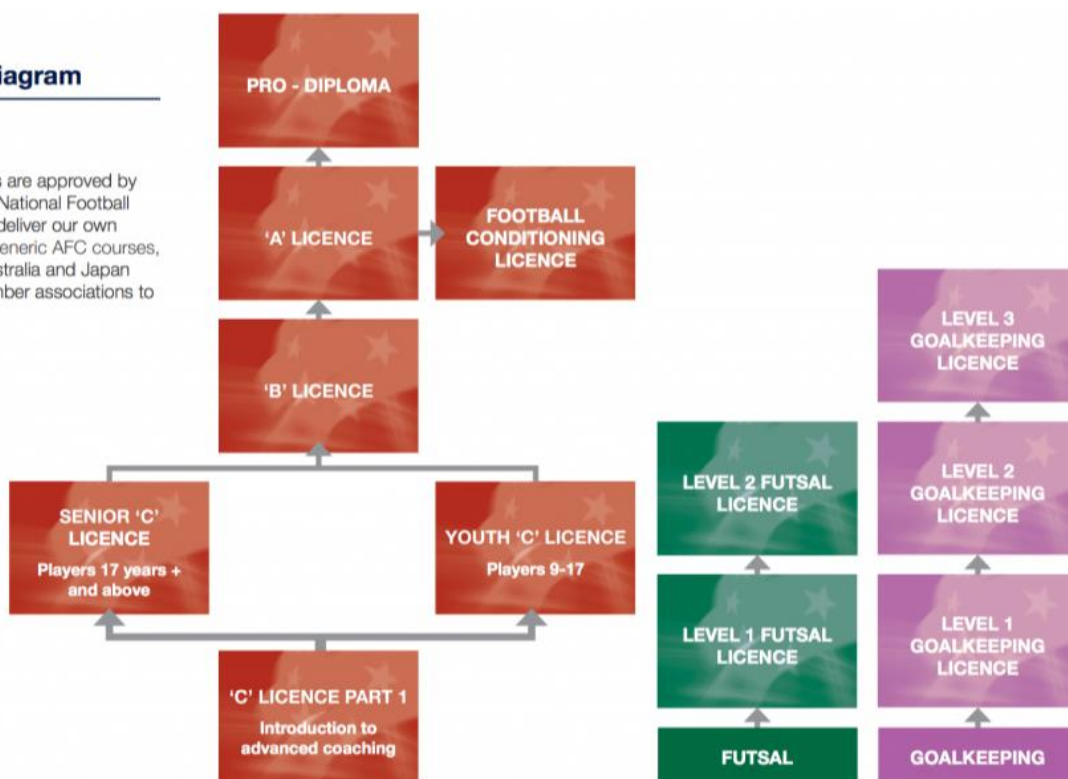
FFA Curriculum and Coaching Pathway diagrams

FFA's Advanced Pathway courses are approved by AFC. Since Australia has its own National Football Curriculum, we naturally need to deliver our own specific courses rather than the generic AFC courses, and AFC has recognised this (Australia and Japan are the only two of AFC's 46 member associations to have this right).



3. TRAINING EQUIPMENT POLICY STATEMENT

KCSC will aim to

- provide a ball for every player at the club during club training sessions.
- build and maintain a complete set of appropriate coaching and training equipment (as described below) for registered players in each team, relevant to the methods set out in the FFA National curriculum.
- ensure that training equipment is used and maintained in an appropriate and safe manner.
